LEASH LAW

On March 12, 1992 the Board of Selectmen adopted the following amendment to our present Dog Ordinance:

SECTION 14. LEASHLAW No owner may allow a dog to run free without restraint, either on a hitch or rope or within a penned or fenced area, with the following boundaries of the unincorporated Village of Franklin and East Franklin;

FRANKLIN VILLAGE

Beginning at a point on the North Sheldon Road in the edge of S.A. Highway 120 on the south line of Clark Hubbard's Big Hill Farm and John and Kathy Ovitt's farm; thence running easterly along Ovitt's southerly line to the south east corner of the Ovitt Farm; thence turning and running northerly along Ovitt's east line fence to the tree line behind Carroll and Sally Hull's farm meadow, an approximate distance of 1000 feet from S.A. 120, continuing in a straight line and crossing S.A. 120, the so-called Lake Road, near the dwelling of Ronald and Linda Meunier, and continuing from said Lake Road - 1000 feet thence turning and running westerly across the so-called Middle Road on a line parallel with the so-called Lake Road to Rt. 235; thence turning and running southerly on Rt. 235 in a straight line and continuing in a straight line across Mrs. Joseph Bouchard's land, behind the new Franklin Elementary School grounds, across land of Jeffrey & Debora Grennon and Thomas & Nancy Magnant to the intersection of County Road - T.H. 37 and crossing lands of Roger & Louise Gagne to a point behind the Webster Spring; thence turning and running easterly along Clark Hubbard's south line to the point of beginning on S.A. 120.

EAST FRANKLIN VILLAGE

Beginning at a point southerly of Charlene and Michael Benjamin's farm buildings and continuing easterly across Pike River and across the farm lands of Charlene and Michael Benjamin and N. James Benjamin Jr.; crossing Rt. 120 and the State Park Road, just southerly of a point where these roads intersect, thence turning and running easterly behind the East Franklin Cemetery and running to the Berkshire Town Line; thence turning and running northerly along the north line of the Carswell land, crossing Pike River and continuing to a point behind the dwelling of Royal Martineau (East Franklin School House) thence turning and running southerly across the meadow lands of Marcel and Shirley Fregeau, crossing T.H. 12 westerly on the farm lands of Charlene and Michael Benjamin, back to the point of beginning.

Dogs found at large without restraint or outside the direct control of an individual shall be impounded.

The full dog ordinance may be read at the Town Clerk's Office during regular office hours or more information may be had by phoning 285-2101.

Statement of Petition: Voters may petition the Selectmen for a vote to disapprove this ordinance. If a petition is forthcoming it must be filed with the clerk by April 25, 1992. If no petition is received this ordinance shall take effect on May 11, 1992.
